# **Upgrade plans over the summer**

The Foundation also plans to install a portico "cover" for the patio next to the bocce courts to increase shading for that area as well as upgrade some landscaping around the campus.

The Foundation has a few infrastructure plans in development that include redesigning the Fitness Center for better space utilization with a 500-square-foot addition for a spin room. There are also plans to add more pickleball courts. However, before any new infrastructure can be approved, we must first adequate parking.

To do this, we have decided to obtain a parking needs analysis. This study will definitively tell us how many additional parking spaces, if any, will be required by the County for any proposed infrastructure projects.

By the time you read this, we will have held the Annual Meeting and the Board will have a few new members. I know that the new Board will continue to work hard on behalf of all the members of Pelican Marsh.

the hot and rainy weather that summer can bring. We want to make Courtside your yearround go-to hangout.



The staff really appreciates everyone's help and support over this past season. For those heading back north, safe travels and have a great summer!





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


#### **Get involved**



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### **Golf fitness**

Training in Florida's "off season"

Oddly enough, the summer is our "off season" in Florida, and off season is the ideal time to develop a solid physical foundation for your golf swing.

Golf fitness training in the off season can greatly benefit golfers, regardless of age, in the improvement of their skills on the course. Often, golfers will neglect the physical components critical to the execution of a biomechanically efficient golf swing. With little time to develop the physical requirements of the golf swing during the golf season, golfers spend an inordinate amount of time and money on practicing and golf lessons, mostly utilizing compensatory strategies for physical deficiencies, with minimal improvement.

It is important to keep up your fitness routine during the off season. Maintaining strength, flexibility and endurance will not only help improve your golf game next season, but also prevent injury and keep you feeling your best year-round.

Physical limitations in the areas of mobility, flexibility, stability, strength and power limit the ability of the golfer to execute a biomechanically efficient golf swing. Golfers should remember that

it is the kinetic chain of physical events that enables the body to execute the phases of the golf swing properly. For the athletic movements of the golf swing to be performed with efficiency, it is critical that each of these physical parameters be met within the kinetic chain.

Here are a few tips for offseason golf fitness:

# Focus on strength training

Building strength in your



core, legs and upper body can help improve your swing and prevent injury. Incorporate exercises like squats, lunges, pushups and planks into your routine.

#### Work on flexibility

Maintaining flexibility in your hips, shoulders and back can help improve your range of motion and prevent injury. Incorporate stretching, yoga or Pilates into your routine.

# Maintain cardiovascular endurance

Keeping up with cardiovascular exercise like running, cycling or swimming can help improve your endurance on the golf course.


#### **Practice your golf swing**

Take advantage of indoor driving ranges or simulators to practice your swing during the off season. This can help improve your form and maintain muscle memory.

# Stay hydrated and well nourished

Drinking plenty of water and eating a balanced diet can help keep you feeling energized and focused on the course.

Remember, off-season fitness can be just as important as in-season fitness for improving your golf game and preventing injury. Incorporate these tips into your routine, and you'll be ready to hit the links again in no time!


beautiful trails. One of these is the Bird Rookery Swamp Trail, which opened in July 2011. It offers 12 miles of hiking and biking trails, including


Here's how you can help us celebrate World Book Day.

Once again, congratulations and thank you for being such a generous community.



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
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# Thank you for a great season!

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#### NAPLES HOUSING MARKET UPDATE

NABOR's January 2023 Market Report indicated growing confidence in the Naples real estate market as a wave of new sellers entered the market. New listings in January rose 74.5% compared to December 2022, offering buyers many more options in their search. Although closed sales in January 2023 decreased 33.8% compared to January 2022, the spike in new listings is promising. Even with the rise in home inventory during January, it did not restrain home values as median closed prices rose 11.1% to \$600,000 from \$540,000 in January 2022. And pending sales in January were remarkably higher than pending sales in December 2022. The optimistic outlook could result in a positive home buying season!
