
Guest policy

As a reminder, local guests are not permitted to use any of the Community Center facilities from open to noon, Monday thru Friday. Additionally, local guests are only permitted to play pickleball/tennis up to four times per month. These restrictions are in place from Nov. 1 through April 30 to assure members have access to amenities during our peak/ busiest times.

Note: A local guest is defined as visiting friends or family members who live in the Naples area and are just visiting for the day. Please go to the Pelican Marsh website, www. pelicanmarsh.com, to view the Foundation's complete rules, regulations and polices. Your cooperation in following the rules and regulations is appreciated as we need to keep our amenities fun and equitable for everyone.

2023 Foundation budget

The Board of Directors has approved the 2023 Foundation budget, which is divided into



two parts: 1) the operational assessment that pays for all amenities and services at the Community Center and 2) the cable/internet assessment that pays for the cable and internet services provided to each home.

The yearly operational assessment is increasing \$167, mainly due to payroll adjustments for the market, rising insurance rates, contingency for food & beverage, and other general inflationary costs. However, you are still only paying \$67 a month, which includes a fitness center, tennis and pickleball program, bocce, activities program and many other social events and services.

The yearly cable/internet assessment is increasing \$45 in accordance with our contract. Even with this increase, you are only paying \$93.92 a month, which is far less than retail for the same services. Add this all up and you will see that Pelican Marsh is still a great deal compared to other area communities!

A big thank you to the Finance Committee and staff bookkeeper for their help in putting the budget together. A copy of the 2023 budget is on the Pelican Marsh website for review.

Maintenance and upkeep

It is that time of year to inspect your home for any cleaning and/or repairs that need to be done. Rainy season causes dirt and mildew buildup on roofs, driveways, walkways and the walls of your home. 

A Message from your Director of Court Sports

We kicked off our 2022/2023 season with the Tri-Court Challenge in which more than 70 players participated on our pickleball, tennis and bocce courts. Along with the great fun of the event, we raised over \$22,000 for Guadalupe Center. We are blessed to have so many generous volunteers and players. A special thank you goes out to Lynn Atzingen, Tina Mantel and Cathy Aquino for all their hard work in making this event such a success.

On Halloween, we brought back the Dink & Glow pickleball event, which quickly sold out. If you have not participated in this event, you do not want to miss it next time. This blacklight pickleball experience is one of a kind.

Next, we had a great group of tennis players challenging their various tennis skills in the Tennis Olympics. Congratulations to all the event winners and overall champion, Barry Hoffberg.

We followed the Olympics with a very entertaining tennis exhibition featuring Victor Monteiro and Jay Gillespie. They won a very close match in a third set tiebreaker. Thank you to all who came out to support this event. We look forward to hosting more exhibitions and the Naples Pro League in early 2023.



It is great to see our seasonal friends returning and adding to Pelican Marsh's energy on and off the courts. It is also a good time to remind everyone of the procedure for making court reservations, as they are slightly different for tennis and pickleball.

Tennis reservations

On the tennis side, we use a modified lottery system for allocating courts. Courts are allocated at noon one week in advance. To reserve a court, a member must submit a court request sheet with the Pro Shop at least one week in advance.

Priority is given to requests from players who did not play on that particular day of the week before (Monday to Monday, Tuesday to Tuesday, etc.). Second priority goes to players who did not receive their requested times the week before. Last priority goes to players that *continued on page 6*

played at the desired time the week prior. If all else is equal, court sheets are drawn at random. After all courts are allocated for the next week (Monday to Monday...) they go live on CourtReserve at 2 p.m. Any remaining open courts may be reserved on CourtReserve within one week.

Reservations for clinics, Cardio Tennis and Round Robins may be made on CourtReserve starting at 2 p.m. one week in advance. The system will send out court confirmations and a reminder the day before.

Pickleball reservations

On the pickleball side, court reservations are made strictly on CourtReserve or through the Pro Shop starting at 2 p.m., one week in advance. We currently have three open play mornings: Monday, Wednesday and Saturday. Even though you may show up at any time, we ask that you still "reserve" a spot so that we may accurately track the activity on the courts.

On Tuesdays and Thursdays, we have a rotating schedule of Round Robins broken down by levels. On Fridays, we host a ladder league.

We are always looking for ways to improve your court experience here at Pelican Marsh. If you have any ideas or suggestions, please let us know. As we get busier on the courts, please remember to play with gratitude.

Down the middle solves the riddle. See you on the courts! Cheers.



OUR FITNESS FACILITY Welcome back to your Fitness Center

Welcome back to all our returning residents and greetings to all those new to Pelican Marsh. I am sure that everyone has continued to maintain their fitness through the summer! Here at the Pelican Marsh Fitness Center, we continue to provide a safe, comfortable and versatile setting that will contribute to your success as you pursue your wellness and fitness goals.

Our staff stands ready to assist you in any way. If there is not a staff member to help you immediately, please feel free to set up an appointment for a complementary orientation. This half-hour orientation provides a basic total body workout along with the opportunity to ask any questions you may have. With so many new residents, I would like to remind everyone of our gym policies and guidelines.



Note that we do not provide towel service. I recommend that residents bring a towel and lay it over the seat while using the equipment. Wipe down the equipment before use with our disinfectant towelettes, especially the handles. Then wipe down your machine or bench after you are done. Hand sanitizer is strategically placed around the Community Center, so use often. The following are some additional policies:

• Wipe down equipment after each use.

• Observe a 30-minute limit

on all equipment when others are waiting.

• Refrain from cellphone use within the Fitness Center.

• Return equipment to designated areas after use.

• Do not drop weights. If you can't set it down quietly, don't pick it up.

• Children under the age of 12 are not permitted.

• Residents 12 to 15 years of age must be accompanied by and under the direct supervision of an adult.

• Only certified personal trainers approved by the director of fitness may professionally train or provide orientations to residents. Please note that this also applies to trainers livestreaming virtually over a phone or tablet.

Come train with Levi Hanks in combo weight training/ TRX (Total Body Resistance Training) classes! Suspension training bodyweight exercise develops strength, balance, flexibility and core stability simultaneously. TRX is a system that leverages gravity and your body weight to perform hundreds of exercises. You're in control of how much you want to challenge yourself on each exercise because you can simply adjust your body position to add or decrease resistance to deliver a fast, effective total-body workout.

build a rock-solid core as well as increase muscular endurance and strength. Appropriate for people of all fitness levels (pro athletes to seniors).

Cardio Spin!

Due to high demand, additional Cardio Spin classes have been added to the schedule. Alex Plonka will guide participants through workout phases, warmup, steady uptempo cadences, sprints, climbs, cool-downs, etc. You control the resistance on your bike to make pedaling as easy or difficult as you choose. All you'll need is workout clothes, a towel and a water bottle. Spinning bikes have both toe-clips and SPD pedals so you can wear tennis shoes or Shimano-style SPD cleats.

Chair Yoga

With Ellen Riorden as your guide and teacher, chair yoga is perfect for those experiencing limited range of motion and who find it challenging to transition from seated to standing yoga poses. Working with chairs, poses are modified to assist balance and strengthen muscles. We incorporate breathing techniques that help calm the mind, oxygenate the blood and relax the body.

Golf Stretch workshop

Functional flexibility/mobility is the ability to move muscles and joints at different angles and ranges of motion specific to the task or athletic movement at hand. This workshop

combines golf-specific stretching and drills to strengthen stability and stretch for flexibility at the many different angles and ranges of motion associated with the golf swing. This may be the most important fitness component for a golfer to enhance and maintain. In golf, swing speed is determined by the ability to accelerate in a controlled fashion. Flexible muscles move faster against strong stabilizers and enhance mobility/stability in the joints. This results in increased club head speed and better accuracy and consistency.







Better than a Bistro

New to Pelican Marsh this year, Better than a Bistro brings products you won't typically find in the grocery store on Thursdays, 10 a.m.-4 p.m at the Community Center parking lot.

One unusual item is Miyazaki beef, which is 100% Japanese Wagyu from Miyazaki Prefecture. The breed of cow used is Kuroge Wagyu, also known as "Japanese Black." It is one of four Wagyu breeds that exist today, with Kuroge being the largest of the four main Wagyu breeds.

Miyazaki Wagyu is recognized for its cherry red color, tender texture and great dense meat taste. The snowflake-like fat is evenly distributed and produces a non-greasy flavor. It begins to dissolve at the temperature of 25 degrees Celsius, melting right in the mouth.

Wagyu from Miyazaki Prefecture are raised on Kyushu Island, the third largest island of Japan's five main islands. It is known for its agricultural industry and for producing some of the best Wagyu in Japan.

When you buy Miyazaki, you know you are getting the best Wagyu from Japan. This attention to detail provides the highest quality mouthwatering tenderness every time.

tage and food, combined with modern techniques, to create pastas and sauces that can be cooked simply in your kitchen.



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
